The Florida Gamma chapter of Sigma Phi Epsilon has many distinguished alumni. In this issue we highlight one who is not only extremely active with the chapter but is also accomplished in his profession and in the community at large, Fred Karlinsky, University of Miami class of 1989. Fred attended private and public schools in Miami and then matriculated to the U. Fred Karlinsky or as he was affectionately nicknamed by his fellow brothers - 'Derfinski' or "Linski" was introduced to SigEp by one of his best friends not only then but still to this day - Barry Kates. Fred put it best that "SigEp seemed like a place that people wanted to be. I was a very serious and ambitious person even back then and, during that time, SigEp was not only serious about being the best fraternity on campus, with very high goals set for GPA, student government, athletics, etc, but SigEp was an extremely fun experience for its Brother's as well. That is what pushed me to pledge my sophomore year."

During his time at the U, Karlinsky was known for being an extremely active member of a number of U organizations. Fred was the Anheuser-Busch campus representative — the 'Bud Man" — a position that Barry Kates passed down to Fred once Barry graduated. This is a position that Fred 3 years later would pass down to his SigEp and actual brother, Lee Karlinsky. Fred also chaired the Rathskeller advisory board that brought talent like Jerry Seinfeld, other comedians, and bands to the U. In addition to his role with the Rat, Fred was also a member of the U student government Senate and a Justice on the U Supreme Court. Based in part on his roles and interactions with the U's administration, Karlinsky would act as an informal liaison for SigEp to the administration. Karlinsky's early advocacy skills were called on to help get SigEp out of hot water with the administration on a number of occasions, benefitting SigEp greatly. During Fred's SigEp undergraduate years, we elected Brothers Joe Garcia and Bill Barzee Student Body Government presidents. Fred was instrumental in both of their elections as well as other elections that benefitted SigEp.



Some of Fred's favorite memories were the Friday nights after the Brothers Chapter Meetings. Back then the Chapters would have a weekly meeting at 4:30pm at the suite and once it was over EVERY ONE of the Brothers and Pledges would go to the Rat for Happy Hour! There would be 100 SigEp amongst the 400 – 500 students there. An avid 'Canes fan, Karlinsky was known to never miss a single football game during the glory days of football at the U while he was in school. Like Barry Kates, he also spent several years producing "The Jimmy Johnson Show" while in school. When asked how Sigma Phi Epsilon contributed to his time at the University of Miami, Karlinsky stated that the brotherhood he formed while in school has truly lasted him a lifetime. "SigEp gave me brothers who I still know and trust. Brothers who care about me and that I care very much about to this day". To Karlinsky, there are never any pretenses. Fred said "whenever we all get together, no matter the successes or the pitfalls of everybody's lives, we act as if we were just together the day before and it's 1988 all over again. I love that." He is jubilant over the brotherhood, true friendship, and camaraderie that as a Brother of SigEp Florida Gamma Chapter; sharing experiences that can be talked about 30 years later like they happened

yesterday. The recent Michigan State SigEp Alumni reunion last September has shown him that the virtue, diligence, and brotherly love of Sigma Phi Epsilon is truly a lifelong gift.

After his time on Biscayne's wondrous shores, Fred attended Law School at Florida State University where he attained a very prestigious and competitive internship in the State of Florida House of Representatives. From there Fred, although never looking for a public political office, has ingrained himself into political arenas. Not only long-time friends with many state and federal political leaders, he counts both Senator Rick Scott and Senator Marco Rubio as longtime friends. Fred also has been a regulatory and transactional attorney for many years representing insurance companies and their interests. This role has allowed Fred to travel extensively over the past 30 years. For the last 8 years, Fred has served the State of Florida as a member of the for Judicial Nomination Committee for the Florida Supreme Court, which he currently chairs. Fred also served on the 2017/2018 Constitution Revision Commission for the State of Florida. Fred is a shareholder in the international law firm Greenberg Traurig and serves as Global Chair of its Insurance

Regulatory and Transactions Practice. Fred is a member of the firm's Executive Committee and primarily works out of the firms Ft Lauderdale and Tallahassee offices.
